Damodarshree National Award For

Academic Excellence 2022

S.S. Khanna Girls' Degree College, Prayagraj andthe Saraswat Khatri Pathshala Society instituted a National Level Academic award "Damodarshree," in fond memory of Prof. Damodardas Khanna who was a pioneer in the field of education. This event has been held annually since 2011. The auspicious award ceremony of Damodarshree National Essay Competition was held on October 15, 2022. The topic of Damodarshree 2022 was "Are you there God." A total of 307 articles were submitted, of which 187 were submitted locally and 120 were submitted remotely. With participants from states all over India, including Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Kerala, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Uttarakhand, Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Karnataka, Gujarat, Punjab, Chandigarh, West Bengal, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Orissa, and Jharkhand, the essay competition displayed a genuinely national fervour. Participants came from a variety of fields, including science, B.Ed., commerce, law, I.I.T., engineering, and medical science, in addition to the arts. Eminent institutions including the IIT, IIFT, AIIMS, and National Law University submitted entries.

Prof. Alka Agarwal, Vice President of the Damodarshree Committee, enunciated the theme of this session: "**Are you there God**." In the advocacy phase, the 10 contestants whose essays were chosen presented and defended their perspectives to the judges.

The 10 members of the jury who have evaluated the essays are renowned scholars and academicians. The team of evaluators includes prominent members: Prof. Alka Agrawal, Prof. Anita Gopesh, Ms. Deepali Joshi Pant, Dr. Jaya Kapoor, Dr. Anirban, Prof. Pratima Gaur, Prof. Mridula Tripathi, Prof. Prashant Kumar Ghosh, Dr. Rajesh Mishra, and Dr. V. P. Sahi. Mr. Vikas Swarup, the Chief Guest, stated in his address that by felicitating awards to the participants through the National Essay Competition, Damodarshree,the college is honouring critical thinking of today's generation. He told the students the attributes of a good leader, which he termed "the 4 Cs," Creativity, Courage, Communication and Compassion.

The topic for the next year,i.e., Damodarshree 2023 was declared, as "World we are in; world we wish to create."




International Student's Day: 17.11.2022

In books, cuteness can also be a source of solace or escape. Cute elements, such as cuddly creatures, whimsical settings, or cosy environments, can create a sense of warmth, safety, and innocence. They can provide readers with a respite from the difficulties and complexities of everyday life, offering a reassuring and uplifting reading experience.

Furthermore, cuteness in literature can represent notions of purity, innocence, and simplicity. Cute characters are frequently shown as innocent, naive, and unaffected by the harsh facts of life. They may reflect the best of humanity or childhood, exemplifying traits like joy, friendliness, and inquisitiveness. A sensation of wonder and nostalgia can be evoked by cuteness, which might additionally emphasize the beauty and purity of the human soul.

In literature, cuteness can also serve as a plot device, advancing the plot and enhancing character dynamics. For instance, endearing individuals might spur conflict or change and advance the plot. A stern protagonist and an adorable sidekick, for example, can create interesting contrasts or dynamics with one another that can result in sweet or funny exchanges. Additionally, adorable locations or items might act as motifs or symbols to reflect themes or concepts in the narrative.

However, there are difficulties and objections to the prospect of sweetness in writing. Some academics contend that the use of cuteness in literature can be unduly simplistic or shallow, relying on a formulaic and commercialized portrayal of cuteness that is devoid of nuance or complexity. Others contend that cuteness can reinforce gender roles or promote harmful stereotypes, particularly in children's literature where cute characters are frequently sexualized or gendered.

In conclusion, the phenomenon of cuteness in literature is a dynamic and diverse theme that may be used for a variety of purposes. It can arouse feelings, offer solace, express notions of innocence, and add to the dynamics of the plot and characters. However, it's crucial to evaluate the literary representation of cuteness critically and take into account any potential ramifications for representation, stereotypes, and commercialization.



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


Photography Competition



जैसे ही हम औरत की आज़ादी का तसव्युर करते हैं, हमारे ज़ैहन में योरोप से उठने वाली आवाज़े यानी मिउपदपेज डवउमदजे की तहरीक (स्त्री विमर्श) की याद आने लगती है, जिसने औरत की आज़ादी का परचम बुलन्द किया था। यह नारा इतना प्रभावशाली रहा कि हिन्दुस्तानी समाज और हिन्दुस्तानी साहित्य को भी अपनी गिरफ्त में ले लिया और फिर पूरी दुनियाँ की औरतें इस तहरीक में शामिल हो गयी और अपने वजूद को सुसज्जित तरीक़ से मनवाने के लिये फिक्रमंद रहने लगी। इस तहरीक ने जिस तरह से औरत को चहार—दीवारी, मर्द की गुलामी और समाजी रस्म—ओ—रिवाज़ की गुल्थियों में जकड़ी देवी और बेवस औरत को एक तरह से बाहर निकालने की कोशिश की और यह कोशिश औरत के दिल—ओ—दिमाग पर नक्श कर गये। इस तहरीक का मक़सद औरत को आज़ादी दिलाना, यह आज़ादी तमाम (या फिर यूँ कहें रिवज़ा से लेकर बहार तक) पाबंदियों से नजात का पहला ज़ीना या जिसमें पढ़ने—लिखने, रहन—सहन, खान—पान, पोशाकें, अपनी पसन्द और न पसन्द का ख़ाविन्द (पिती) चुनने वाली उम्मीदे उभरने लगी। बकौल कैफी आज़मी —

अब और क्या तेरा बीमार बाप देगा तुझे। बस एक दुआ कि खुदा तुझको कामयाब करे— वो टाँक दे तिरे आँचल में चाँद और तारे ,तू अपने वास्ते जिसे चाहे इंतिख़ाब करे।

कैफी आज़मी ने अपनी बेटी शबाना आज़मी के जन्मदिन पर यह नज़्म कही थी जाहिर हे एक बाप की हैसियत से अपनी मोहब्बत का इज़हार उसकी आज़ादी के तसव्वुर के रूप में किया है। और उसकी आज़ादी उसके अधिकारों को इतना परवान चढ़ाया कि खुशी में यह बोल ''तु अपने वास्ते जिसे चाहे इंतिख़ाब करे' बड़ी बात कह दी। हम सबको ऐसे ख़्यालों की कद्र करनी चाहिये। गर्ज़ की जिन्दगी के नशेब—ओ—फराज़ से दूर और खुद मालिकाना ज़िन्दगी जीने का ख्वाब, देखने की, तमन्ना का सफर है बक़ौल गालिब ''है कहा तमन्ना का दूसरा कदम या रब' खूब से खूब तर की तलाश की तरफ गामज़न (अग्रसरित) नज़र आने लगी। सच बात तो यह है कि यह सब कुछ इतना आसान न था, और मर्द सोसायटी को बदलना, फिर जिसमें समाजी और मज़हबी रस्म—ओ—रिवाज की चाशनी अपना सिक्का जमा चुकी थी, फिर भी इस तहरीक (आन्दोलन) का असर धीरे—धीरे अपनी दिशा—और—दशा दोनों को एक नया रंग और आँहग देने में कामयाब नज़र आने लगी। सबसे पहले इस फिक्र को आगे बढ़ाने में तरक्की पसन्द (प्रगतिशील लेखको—शायरों) ने अहम भूमिका निभाई। इस तरह कहा जा सकता है कि मजाज़ ने आँचल से परचम बना लेने की बात कही—

तेरे माथे पे यह आँचल बहुत ही खूब है लेकिन। तू इस आँचल से एक परचम बना लेती तो अच्छा था। या फिर कैफी आज़मी — उठ मेरी जान मेरे साथ ही चलना है तुझे। सरदार जाफरी भी इसी रंग की बाते करतें है :--

ये माना मोहब्बत की मंजिल है औरत। तड़पना मचलता दिल है औरत पर उसके ज़मानो—मकॉ और भी हैं सितारों से आगे कहा और भी हैं

फिर फिकशन की बात करें तो इस्मत चुग्ताई, अंगारे वाली रशीद जहाँ और मंटो ने तो एक तरह से मर्दाना समाज की बखिया ही उधेड़ दी। मंटो की कहानियों में समाज का दर्द था। या यूँ कहें कि औरत की मजबूरी और बेबसी की एक अलिमयाँ दास्तान को पेश किया। वह न सिर्फ औरत की बल्कि मर्द सोसायटी और मर्दो की बादशाहियत का खात्मा भी करता नजर आता है। हम उसे यू कह सकते है कि फेमिनिस्ट मूवमेंट का एक दर और खुल जाता है . . इसका असर यह भी हुआ कि समाज में भी एक नयी लहर, एक तरह से बेदार हो गयी, और औरत को अपनी हैसियत अपने वजूद की फिक्र भी होने लगी, इसी फिक्र और ख्याल के तहत औरत ने भी साहित्य के मैदान में कदम रखा और अपनी फिक्र से समाज में एक बदलाव लाने की कोशिश की, वरजिना वल्फ कहती है "इससे पहले कि हम औरतें लिखना शुरू करे यह जरूरी है कि हम इस फरिश्ता सिफत (यानी औरत) का वह रूप जो मर्दो ने उसे दिया है खुत्म कर दें।" इसी बात को आगे बढ़ाते हुए Linda Gordon का कहना है feminism का मतलब है-औरतों के इक्तिदार (अधिकार और हुकुमत) और घरों या समाज में उनके हुकूमत के फरोग (प्रचार के लिये एकमुट होकर जददोजदद करना। औरतों को अपनी आवश्यकता के अनुसार ढालना feminism है।"फिर क्या था उसमें भी मोहब्बत थी, बगावत थी, प्रोटेस्ट था और मोहब्बत और गुस्से की आमेजिश से उसने एक नये खमीर को जन्म दिया। जहा रूह की आजादी हो, बराबरी का दर्जा हो, इंसानियत का पैकर हो और सबसे ज्यादा जिसकी तलाश में थी वह था इंसाफ और मोहब्बत।''हतक''की सौगन्धी में किसी हद तक और सिराज में यह सरतें देखने को मिलती हैं ''वह हर रोज़ रात को उसका पुराना या नया मुलाकाती उससे कहा करता था। सौगन्धी मैं तुझसे प्रेम करता हू, सौगन्धी यह जानती थी कि वह जान बूझकर कि वह झूठ बोलता है। वह मोम हो जाती थी और ऐसा महसूस करती थी जैसे सचमुच उससे प्रेम किया जा रहा है . प्रेम कितना सुंदर बोल है।" बस इसी अच्छाई की तलाश में उसकी दुनियां बदल गयी। बकौल मंटो – "लोग हमें बुरा कहते हैं मालूम नहीं क्यों ,वही मर्द जो रात की तारीकी (अंधेरे) में हमसे राहत मोल लेकर जाते हैं दिन के उजाले में ,हमें नफरत-ओ-हिकारत से देखते हैं।"

कवियत्री फहमीदा रियाज अपनी नज़्म पत्थर की ज़बान में कहती है :- जो अज़्म है उमंग है, तो हम मुदार पायेंगे, जो अश्क में लहु का रंग है तो गुल खिलायेंगे, कभी तो एँ खुदा, कभी तो हम भी मुस्कुराएगें।

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
