On 30th July 2019, a one day workshop '*Parisamvad*' on 'Draft of National Education Policy' was organized by Damodar Das Khanna Arts Faculty of the college under CPE Phase- II Scheme of UGC. Resource persons of this workshop were Prof. Dhananjay Yadav, HOD, Department of Education, University of Allahabad, Prof. H. K. Sharma, Department of Political Science, University of Allahabad and Dr. Umesh Pratap Singh, Department of Economics, Ewing Christian College, Prayagraj. The objective behind holding this workshop was to provide a platform to teaching fraternity to have a discussion about draft of NEP 2019 and expressing their views.

Prof. Dhananjay Yadav emphasized on role of education in linking skills with knowledge to make it job oriented. He also said that preference should be given to mother tongue for imparting primary education.

Dr. Umesh Pratap Singh threw light on major points of new education policy and also discussed about the contribution of makers of NEP. Besides that, he also explained about the practical difficulties of semester system.

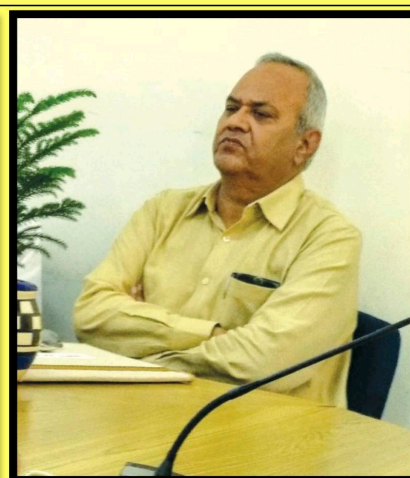

One Day Workshop on Intellectual Property Rights

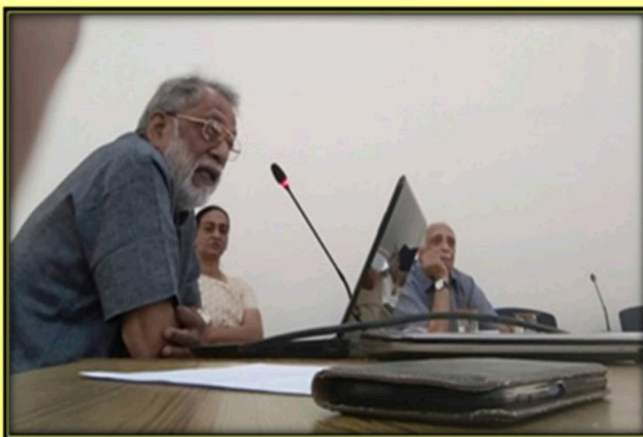




One Day Workshop on Intellectual Property Rights on 6th May, 2019

A one day workshop was organized on 6th May 2019 on the topic of “Intellectual Property Rights” in S.S Khanna Girls’ Degree College under CPE Phase II scheme of UGC. The distinguished speakers of the workshop were Prof. R.K. Tandon (Retd.) Department of Defence & Strategic Studies, University of Allahabad, Prayagraj; Prof. A.K. Misra (Retd.), Department of Computer Science & Engineering, MNNIT, Prayagraj; Prof. K.K. Misra, Department of Computer Science & Engineering, MNNIT, Prayagraj and Dr. Vibhuti Tripathi, Department of Computer Science & Engineering, MNNIT, Prayagraj.

The workshop was convened to impart greater awareness about the issue of IPR which has gained a special importance for all the domains of socio-economic development. Prof. R.K. Tandon briefed about IPR and commented that expression of ideas is the real asset, which is being covered under IPR. Prof. A.K. 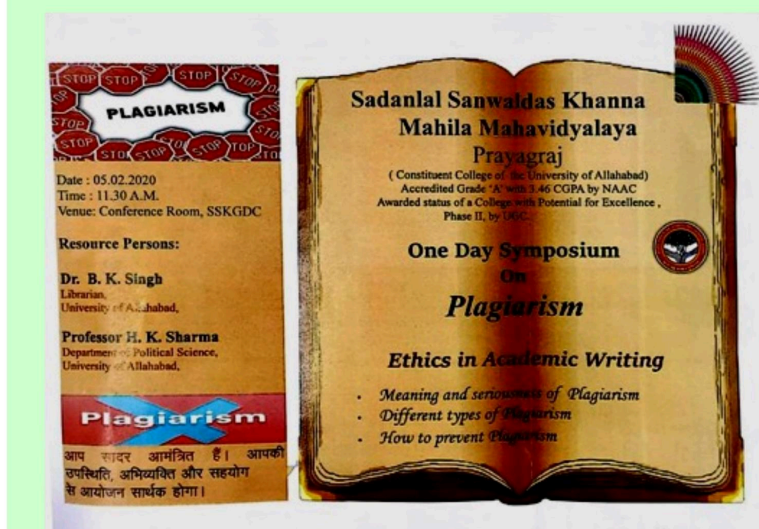




One Day Symposium on 'Plagiarism' on 5th February, 2020

Besides throwing light on provisions regarding plagiarism mentioned in UGC Regulation, 2018, he also gave tips for avoiding plagiarism and discussed about the anti plagiarism tools and different softwares available for checking the level of plagiarism.

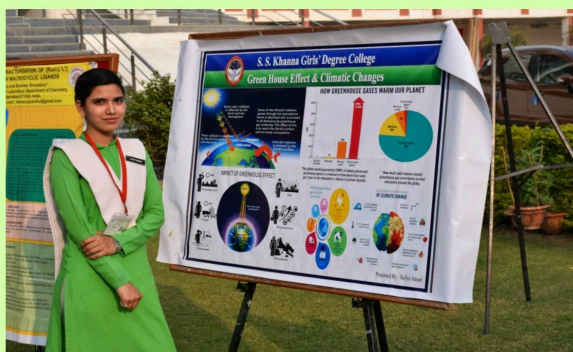

Educational Tours

College had organized several heritage walks for interesting places such as Kaushambi (Buddhist historical site), Pabhosa (Ancient Jain Pilgrimage), Sringeripur(City of Guhraj Nishad, Lamhi (Munshi Premchand's Birth place), Maghmela of Prayagraj, Planatorium and industrial visit to IFFCO under CPE, Phase II during the session 2019-2020.



Tour to Lamhi

On 27th January, 2020, the departments of Hindi and English, S.S. Khanna Girls' Degree College in collaboration with Literary Association of the College organized a one-day Educational Tour to Lamhi, the Birthplace of Munshi Premchand, the acclaimed Hindi writer. The visit benefitted the students greatly who learnt a great deal by associating the man with the writer that he was. Lamhi is situated at a distance of 130 kilometres from Prayagraj.

Tour to Chitrakoot

An educational tour to Chitrakoot was organized for the students of department of medieval history, sociology, geography, political science, psychology, music and painting under CPE Phase II on 6th February 2020 where the students visited four places, respectively, *Gupta Godavari*, *Sati-Anusuya Ashram*, *Ramghat* and *Kamadgiri Temple*. Chitrakoot has religious as well as social and economic importance.

Due to the stony land, agricultural yield is low, but Chitrakoot is known for oilseed crops which was most visible during the visit. Students experienced cultural, linguistic, and agricultural variation on their way of Allahabad to Chitrakoot. In the Gupta Godavari, the students saw a fort constructed out of mountains from which the Godavari River originates however the origin point of river could not be seen. The manner in which the temple was build showed the glimpses of ancient Indian civilization.

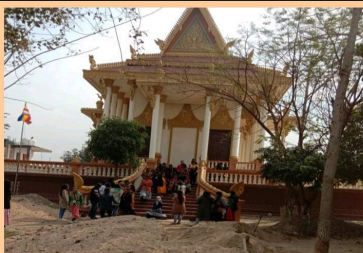

Kaushambi & Pabhosa-

Pabhosa is situated at the bank of river Yamuna, at the distance of 10 Km. from Kaushambi and 70 kilometres from Prayagraj. On 28th January 2020 under CPE phase II, Students of Department of Ancient History, Culture & Archaeology of SSKGDC visited the **Kaushambi**- Capital of Vats maha Janpad in 6th Century B.C. and an important pilgrimage centre for the Buddhists, and **Prabhasgiri (Ancient Pabhosa)**- an important pilgrimage centre for the Jains, where 6th Jain Teerthankar PADMAPRABHU attained deeksha kavalya .There are three hills at pabhosa and inscriptions of post BC era are found here. Students visited ancient cave at hill, saw the sculptures of Thirthankaras, of surya at small museum, Jain temple at hill, modern Jain dharmshala and temple etc. At Kaushambi, Ashokan pillar, inscriptions on pillar, ruins of Ghoshitaram monastery, and modern Kambodian Buddhist temple were landmarks in this Heritage walk.

Under the aegis of Certificate course in Environmental Awareness (CCEA) (UGC, CPE-II) and Department of Chemistry, S.S. Khanna Girls' Degree College organized an industrial visit to the Indian Farmers Fertiliser Cooperative Limited (IFFCO), Phulpur on 21 January 2020. IFFCO has a good brand image and it is a social movement, its main function is to change the lives of farmers while not affecting the environment. The one day visit was organized to give the students a feel of the organization and its working. The trip was inaugurated with the blessing of the Principal Dr Lalima Singh. The 57 students of B.Sc, M.Sc (Chemistry) and students registered under CCEA participated in this educational trip.

Dr. H.M Shukla (Manager, Bio-fertilizer unit, IFFCO) welcomed the students. After introduction of the inception of IFFCO, the students were taken to the plant. They observed the manufacturing process at different stages and interacted with the employees. He described the different activities of Cooperative Rural Development Trust (CORDET) of IFFCO in detail. CORDET is instrumental in demonstrating various farming system models to increase the farm income by organizing various trainings and skill development programs for youth and women. He also explained to students about IFFCO initiative, "Save the Soil Campaign" with focus on soil rejuvenation and crop productivity enhancement for sustainable and environment friendly agriculture. Mr. Birendra Singh, (Junior Assistant, Food processing, IFFCO), briefed the students on crop production system, dairy, balanced fertilization, use of bio-fertilisers, bee-keeping, pisciculture, and fruits and vegetables preservation etc. at Phulpur unit. The students have enjoyed the technical endeavor at IFFCO, and gave very positive feedback. This Visit seems to be very informative and gives good learning experience.

The tour was coordinated by Dr Alok Malaviya and Dr Anuradha Singh under the supervision of Dr Archana Jyoti (coordinator of Science Faculty), Dr Sumita Sahgal, Dr. Swastika Singh and Dr. Ranjana also participated in the tour. The tour was assisted by Mr Mridul, Mr. Sharad, Mr. Suryamani and Mr Brajesh Kumar.

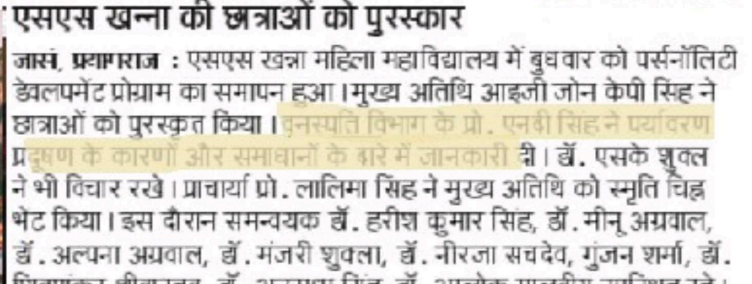

4. Exploitation synergies that exist in a natural ecosystem.
5. Maintenance and improve soil health by stimulating activity or soil organic manures and avoid harming them with pesticides.
6. Optimum economic returns, with a safe, secure, and healthy working environment.
7. Acknowledgement of the virtues of indigenous know-how and traditional farming system
