The Saraswat Khatri Pathshala Society runs the college, exercises its control over policy making for the college, through Governing Body, with the Principal as one of its exofficio members.

The Principal functions through Co-ordinators of various streams, PIO, Bursar, DSW and other important officials, which meets weekly. This expands into the IQAC, which does the planning and evaluation for the college and meets quarterly. Various committees of staff and students take responsibility for the different activities of the college. At the department level, HODS are encouraged to hold meetings periodically and bring points for discussion to the Heads meeting with Principal which is held every month.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

University of Allahabad prepares the syllabus in all the subjects, which is updated by its BACCALAUREATRE (Board of Studies) from time to time. Teachers prepare lecture plans, which are provided to students and it includes number of teaching days and teaching methods for each unit. Teachers, who are the members of the BACCALAUREATRE give their suggestions to enrich the curriculum to control the limitation of the University syllabus and to cater to the needs of the dynamic employment efforts are on to start few more add-on courses other than those running like Bio-Technology, Spoken English and Personality Development.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Teaching plans are prepared and provided to the students.

Teaching learning environment of the institution is student centred, believe in multiple learning experiences and therefore planning field trips, naturalistic enquiry, educational tour, seminar, tutorial, discussion, dialogue, inter college meet, co-curricular activities are our regular features.

- 1. At the beginning of every academic session a schedule of academic and co-curricular activities is drawn up and a calendar of activities for the year is displayed on notice/bulletin boards and printed in the admission prospectus listing dates and programmes during the year.
- 2. On the first day of each session students are informed with a class time-table where the lectures for whole session are planned and assigned to various teachers. A copy of the same is also displayed on the departmental notice board.
- 3. The home examination time-table as per schedule fix in the College Academic calendar is displayed one month in advance on the notice boards.
- 4. After evaluation the students are shown their home examination answer paper in class and the model answers are discussed with the students, indicating where the students could have done better in a particular question.

Creative artists, scientists and eminent persons from different fields are occasionally invited to the College to interact with the students in an effort to enhance students' critical thinking, creativity and scientific temper. Brain storming method is widely used by the teachers.

All the faculty in the College have put up their Wall Magazine whose display is handled totally by the students of different classes in rotational manner. Creative write-ups as well as articles by the students are put up in the Wall Magazine along with the interesting tit-bits and pictures.

The seminar method, in which students themselves are guided to present the topics for the class, is also used. Peer teaching and learning through group academic activities such as projects, exhibitions and presentations help students to take responsibility for what is learnt.

The College adopts 'blended learning', which complements class teaching with on time resources and interaction. Internet facility is available to students. An excellent library and access to online resources help the student to gain competency in reference work.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The College monitors the progress of the students through class test, question – answer, quiz, home examination and practicals. Beside their problems, their performances are discussed with the parents, guardians by conducting parent – teacher meetings.

Students performing poorly in home examination or class tests are motivated to attend remedial classes and tutorials. At the personal level teachers try to find the causes

for unsatisfactory performance of the students and if they are found suffering from economic problems, they are provided specimen books by the teachers.

Those students who are found to be meritorious but face difficulties due to poverty are given scholarship. The College also awards the topper in each stream and each subject annually in order to boost their morale.

SKP Society helps the needy students in every way possible.

At the U.G. level there is no formal internal assessment.

In B.Ed. course 100 marks are for various practical activities. It is departmental level assessment. For insuring rigor and transparency in the internal assessment these policies are being followed -

- Dates of activities are declared along with the academic calendar, when the session starts.
 - The syllabus of the internal assessment is conveyed to all the trainees.
 - Pattern of assessment is followed according to the University guidelines.
- All the records of internal assessment are maintained by internal examination committee.

A Research Committee has been constituted to facilitate and monitor funded and non-funded research projects. The Committee invites proposals for minor and major projects funded by the UGC. It facilitates access to research oriented activities like research paper presentation at national and international conferences and publications of research papers.
