The vision of the institution is to help the girl students discover their innate potential and promote them towards their personal and social benefits.

The mission of the institution is to raise the level of education of the girls belonging to the lower and middle sections of society as well as minority class. Achievement and realization of their goals, to make the girls student independent and self reliant to undertake future courses and training programme in order to make them economically independent.

The Saraswat Khatri Pathshala Society runs the college, exercises its control over policy making for the college, through Governing Body, with the Principal as one of its ex-officio members.

The Principal functions through Co-ordinators of various streams, PIO, Bursar, DSW and other important officials, which meets weekly. This expands into the IQAC, which does the planning and evaluation for the college and meets quarterly. Various committees of staff and students take responsibility for the different activities of the college. At the department level, HODs are encouraged to hold meetings periodically and bring points for discussion to the Heads meeting with Principal which is held every month.

 - ➤ Department of Painting focuses on lectures, seminars, workshops, demonstrations, PPT, etc.
 - ➤ Department of Economics and Philosophy use lecture method, project method, PPT, problem solving method, discussion method, inductive-deductive method.
 - ➤ Department of Science subjects (Chemistry, Zoology, Botany, Physics and Mathematics) and Office Management & Secretarial Practice focus on lectures, PPT, project method, discussion, seminar, quiz, demonstration, group discussion, learning by doing etc.
 - ➤ Commerce faculty focuses on PPT, lecture method, socialized reaction method, supervised study method, discussion method, etc.
 - ➤ B.Ed. faculty focuses on various teaching methods such as micro teaching, macro teaching, lecture demonstration, discussion, computer assisted teaching, project method, etc.
 - College magazine and newsletters are released by the college. Students are encouraged to write articles, poems, participate in interclass and intercollegiate competitions.
 - A wide range of various activities augment learning outcomes:
 - > Capacity building and Personality development programmes on soft skills, life skills, seminars, workshops conducted by the college and the various departments on university, state and national level














